## October 2025

Wed 1 Oct	Psalm 56:8 says that God will list his tears on His scroll. Therefore, pray for consolation of the bereaved families of the victims who were murdered or perished. Pray for the release of the hostages who are still imprisoned.
Thu 2 Oct Yom Kippur	<b>Day of Atonement.</b> "Come now, let us settle the matter," says the LORD. "Though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow; though they are red as crimson, they shall be like wool" (Isaiah 1:18). Give thanks for God's grace and forgiveness which is the central aspect during Yom Kippur.
Fri 3 Oct	Nehemiah 2:4 contains the shortest prayer of the Bible. Nehemiah, who is deeply saddened by the situation in Jerusalem and by those who have returned, cannot hide his sorrow from the Persian king. When the king questioned him, Nehemiah prayed to God in heaven before giving his reply. This shows us that God hears even the briefest of prayers. Let us pray that the prayers rising from the Jewish people to God may be heard and answered.
Sat 4 Oct Sabbath	"From Zion, perfect in beauty, God shines forth. Our God comes and will not be silent; a fire devours before Him, and around Him a tempest rages" (Psalm 50:2-3). Give thanks for God's greatness.
Sun 5 Oct	Pray that God may touch Christians in your country with His love for His people. Pray that Christians may see their connection with the Jewish people.
Mon 6 Oct Sukkot	Jeremiah 31 is actually the Bible in a nutshell. God's work to redeem Israel and the nations is addressed in all aspects. In Jeremiah 31 it says that vineyards will be planted again on the hills of Samaria. We may thank that God fulfils all His promises, especially in our days. Since about thirty

	years there are more than 800 winegrowers in Samaria who plant the hills of the mountains of Israel again and may reap the fruits of it.
<b>Tue 7 Oct Sukkot   Commemoration Oct 7<sup>th</sup>.</b>	Today there are commemorations for the terrible attack of Hamas that took place two years ago. Pray for God's comfort for the family members of the victims and pray for the healing of this national trauma.
<b>Wed 8 Oct Sukkot</b>	During Sukkot, the Feast of Tabernacles, Psalms are sung, especially the Hallel Psalms (113-118). Pray today with this Psalm: "Praise the LORD. Praise the LORD, you His servants; praise the name of the LORD. Let the name of the LORD be praised, both now and forevermore" (Psalm 113:1-2).
<b>Thu 9 Oct Sukkot</b>	"Tremble, earth, at the presence of the Lord, at the presence of the God of Jacob, who turned the rock into a pool, the hard rock into springs of water" (Psalm 114:7-8). In these verses the renewing, refreshing and life-giving power of God stands out. Pray that God will do a renewing work in the hearts of the Israeli people through which they touch God's love anew or again.
<b>Fri 10 Oct Sukkot</b>	"All you Israelites, trust in the LORD— He is their help and shield" (Psalm 115:9). During the war in Gaza miracles have happened during which soldiers were spared miraculously. For instance, a bomb was placed on an IDF army vehicle that didn't go off. Give thanks for these miracles and God's protection.
<b>Sat 11 Oct Sabbath   Sukkot</b>	"The LORD is gracious and righteous; our God is full of compassion. The LORD protects the unwary; when I was brought low, He saved me" (Psalm 116:5-6). Throughout Scripture, it is evident that God cares for those who are weary, burdened, or crushed in spirit. Give thanks for God's grace and pray that He will redeem the Israeli people who groan under the ongoing war and threat.
<b>Sun 12 Oct Sukkot</b>	"Praise the LORD, all you nations; extol Him, all you peoples. For great is His love toward us, and the faithfulness of the LORD endures forever. Praise the LORD" (Psalm 117). Pray that the day will come when all Gentile nations will unite in praising the God of Israel.
<b>Mon 13 Oct Sukkot</b>	"Blessed is He who comes in the name of the LORD. From the house of the LORD we bless you" (Psalm 118:26). Pray for a blessing for the Jewish people and that God's faithfulness may protect them.
<b>Tue 14 Oct Simchat Torah</b>	"Then the LORD said to him, 'This is the land I promised on oath to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob when I said, "I will give it to your descendants." I have let you see it with your eyes, but you will not cross over into it'" (Deuteronomy 34:4). At Simchat Torah the final portion of Deuteronomy is read. After that the cycle starts anew and in a year's time the first five Books of the Bible are read. Pray for a blessed holiday and God's presence.
<b>Wed 15 Oct Simchat Torah</b>	The enemy knows how to blind people by repeating the same lies over and over again. This was true for centuries regarding the place of Israel's people in God's plan for the world, and today it also applies to the place of God's Land. The lie may seem strong but is so insignificant compared to the power of God's Word. Pray that God's Word will reach and touch the present leaders of the world.
<b>Thu 16 Oct</b>	Pray that the truth about Israel is spread today. A word so powerful that it destroys every lie about Israel.
<b>Fri 17 Oct</b>	Daniel humbled himself for the sins of his people, to remind God of His promise to restore Israel. (Daniel 9:1-20). It is remarkable that he talks of "we", while Daniel is one of the righteous of the world, according to Ezekiel. We may humble ourselves and remind God of His promise to Israel in these days.
<b>Sat 18 Oct Sabbath</b>	"The LORD has done it this very day; let us rejoice today and be glad." (Psalm 118:24). Thank God that He has set aside a day each week for creation to rest.
<b>Sun 19 Oct</b>	"Is not Ephraim My dear son, the child in whom I delight? Though I often speak against him, I still remember him. Therefore My heart yearns for him; I have great compassion for him," declares the LORD" (Jeremiah 31:20). Thank God today for His mercy on His people.
<b>Mon 20 Oct</b>	Pray for Judea and Samaria. Pray for the hundreds of thousands of people who live in the area and that they can live safely and quietly in the Land God has promised them for eternity.
<b>Tue 21 Oct</b>	Pray for the children of Israel. Pray that they may prosper and that they are comforted when they are sad, that they find hope when they feel discouraged, that they feel loved when they feel lonely.
<b>Wed 22 Oct</b>	God's Word endures forever, yet it is essential for us to place our hope in it. Pray that God's people may be filled today with renewed and steadfast hope.

<b>Thu 23 Oct</b>	Pray for Israel's wildlife. Pray that it will bear the finest fruits and that the Land this year will produce more crops than any other year.
<b>Fri 24 Oct</b>	We may thank God like in Nehemiah 12:40, when the two choirs gave thanks and then took their two places in the house of God because the building of the wall was finished. Or what PM Netanyahu did after the destruction of the nuclear facilities in Iran. He went to the Kotel to thank the God of Israel. Thus, we may thank God as well for His deliverances for Israel.
<b>Sat 25 Oct Sabbath</b>	Thank God today with this Psalm: "The law of the LORD is perfect, refreshing the soul. The statutes of the LORD are trustworthy, making wise the simple" (Psalm 19:7).
<b>Sun 26 Oct</b>	"The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of His hands. Day after day they pour forth speech; night after night they reveal knowledge" (Psalm 19:1-2). Thank God today with these words.
<b>Mon 27 Oct</b>	Pray for the work of Koen Carlier and his team in Ukraine. They operate in dangerous areas. Give thanks for all the food parcels they have been able to distribute and all of the people they have helped move to Israel.
<b>Tue 28 Oct</b>	Pray that the Bible study book Why Israel?, which was translated into many languages, will be used powerfully and effectively. Pray that more and more Christians will discover what a blessing Israel is for the nations, and that this will deepen their faith and understanding of God's plan.
<b>Wed 29 Oct</b>	Pray for the Christians around us who strongly oppose Israel. Pray that God may touch them with the same love He has for Israel.
<b>Thu 30 Oct</b>	Pray for the Church today with these words: "Keep your servant also from willful sins; may they not rule over me. Then I will be blameless, innocent of great transgression" (Psalm 19:13).
<b>Fri 31 Oct</b>	The Lord Jesus says: "Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you" (Matthew 7:7). Pray for the coming of Messiah and that His righteousness, peace and truth will come from Jerusalem, as we read in Micah 4:1-4.

## November 2025

<b>Sat 1 Nov Sabbath</b>	"The earth is the LORD's, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it; for He founded it on the seas and established it on the waters" (Psalm 24:1-2). Let us praise God with this Psalm.
<b>Sun 2 Nov</b>	"Do good to Your servant according to Your word, LORD" (Psalm 119:65). At the beginning of November 2025, the representatives of the different branches of Christians for Israel come together for personal education and prayer. Pray that this meeting will be a blessed and encouraging time and that our representatives may return encouraged and strengthened to continue the work in their own regions with renewed vigour.
<b>Mon 3 Nov</b>	"But now many nations are gathered against you. They say, 'Let her be defiled, let our eyes gloat over Zion!' But they do not know the thoughts of the LORD; they do not understand His plan, that He has gathered them like sheaves to the threshing floor" (Micah 4:11-12). Pray that the nations will soon humble themselves before the Lord.
<b>Tue 4 Nov</b>	Israelis are increasingly intimidated openly, insulted or abused. Pray that Israelis worldwide may be safe, whether they are travelling or staying somewhere permanently.
<b>Wed 5 Nov</b>	Israel is attacked daily by a sophisticated and worldwide propaganda machine, fuelled by amongst others Qatar, the Muslim Brotherhood and the Iranian Regime. Pray that these parties rapidly lose their influence and that the lies about Israel in the media will be broken.
<b>Thu 6 Nov</b>	We live in a world in which good and evil seem to be reversed. International journalism and media play an important role in this. Pray that the truth will prevail.
<b>Fri 7 Nov</b>	Pray that the Lord will strike the enemies of Israel with blindness and that the evil plans of the enemies of Israel are becoming known to the leaders in Israel. Read 2 Kings 6:6-33.
<b>Sat 8 Nov Sabbath</b>	"Give thanks to the LORD, for He is good; His love endures forever" (Psalm 118:9).
<b>Sun 9 Nov</b>	"The LORD is righteous in all His ways and faithful in all He does. The LORD is near to all who call on Him, to all who call on Him in truth" (Psalm 145:17-18). Pray that Israelis in distress will call upon the Lord and that He will hear them.
<b>Mon 10 Nov</b>	Today the digital world is one of the most effective spreaders of antisemitism. Pray that the social media can't bear hatred and lies about Israel anymore.

<b>Tue 11 Nov</b>	Pray for comfort and encouragement for Jewish parents who are stressful to send their children to school in some countries, because of the visible hatred towards Jews. Pray for the protection of their children. Pray that they may experience God's peace.
<b>Wed 12 Nov</b>	Is antisemitism the same as anti-Zionism? The accompanying slogans are identical in either case. Pray that the source of the hatred against God's people and His Land is destroyed. Pray that this hatred will find no ground to grow in.
<b>Thu 13 Nov</b>	Pray today for the Jewish students who don't feel safe at school, campus or university. Pray that they will be protected and that they can be themselves without worries.
<b>Fri 14 Nov</b>	Education is very important in countering antisemitism. Pray that young people may become acquainted with Judaism, so that they can see how strong and special the Jewish culture and history are.
<b>Sat 15 Nov Sabbath</b>	"Blessed is the people of whom this is true; blessed is the people whose God is the LORD" (Psalm 144:15). Give thanks that God is the God of Israel and that He will never let go of His people.
<b>Sun 16 Nov</b>	In Zechariah 6:13 and 14 we read that Messiah will rebuild the Temple of Jerusalem and that people will come from afar to help build the Temple. Let us pray that the praise may sound soon in its full extent from the house of God, where He will dwell.
<b>Mon 17 Nov</b>	Safe borders of a country are an important part of the overall safety of the country. Think about preventing smuggling weapons or other illegal products, but also stopping terrorists and other threats from abroad. Pray for protection of Israel's borders. Pray that every threat from abroad will be stopped.
<b>Tue 18 Nov</b>	Our strongest weapon in the battle is praising the Lord. Singing God's praises, even when victory seems far away and the wicked have their way as in Psalm 73. After praise the devil flees. This applies both to your personal temptation and in the praise in the Psalms e.g. Psalm 136 for His own People Israel. Praise God with Psalm 136:26 "Give thanks to the God of heaven. His love endures forever."
<b>Wed 19 Nov</b>	When the war broke out in 2023, it became even clearer how extensive Hamas' tunnel network is. These tunnel networks are not only in Gaza, but extend across the borders into Egypt. In this way goods and people can be smuggled in and out. Pray that Hamas' entire tunnel network becomes visible and that it will be dismantled.
<b>Thu 20 Nov</b>	Pray that God's guardian angels will be around Israel to protect the country against attacks from abroad.
<b>Fri 21 Nov</b>	In different ways countries criticise Israel because of its actions in Gaza. Twenty-five Western countries signed a declaration to call Israel to end the war in Gaza. In these declarations Hamas' role is often left out. Pray that the one-sided accusations of Israel will stop.
<b>Sat 22 Nov Sabbath</b>	"Indeed, He who watches over Israel will neither slumber nor sleep" (Psalm 121:4). God will never abandon Israel. He is working so much more than we realize. We may trust Him to hold on to His people, even today. Praise God today with these words.
<b>Sun 23 Nov</b>	Pray for Jerusalem today with these words: "Pray for the peace of Jerusalem: 'May those who love you be secure. May there be peace within your walls and security within your citadels.'" (Psalm 122:6-7).
<b>Mon 24 Nov</b>	Give thanks for the fulfilment of Biblical prophecies and pray that we will keep our eyes open to the Biblical truths that are being fulfilled in our days. Give thanks that just like the prophecies about Lord Jesus were fulfilled, the prophecies about Israel will be fulfilled as well.
<b>Tue 25 Nov</b>	God gave king Jehoshaphat and Judah victory over the Ammonites and Moabites in 2 Chronicles 20. He does this amidst the songs of praise of Israel. Praise the Lord, because His mercy endures for ever. Let us join the songs of praise in the distress Israel is suffering today, so that He gives the victory.
<b>Wed 26 Nov</b>	Pray for protection of the activities of Christians for Israel and other Israel organizations. There are groups active who want to obstruct their work. Pray that these groups will fail.
<b>Thu 27 Nov</b>	In Psalm 51, king David humbles himself for his severe transgressions. He has received his punishment, but then God shows mercy for His people after his confession of guilt (verse 18-19). Therefore, we may approach God's throne of grace with confidence as well, despite of our guilt, due to the redemption our saviour has brought about by His death and resurrection. Let us therefore pray with David: "May it please You to prosper Zion, to build up the walls of Jerusalem."

**Fri 28 Nov**

“The days are coming, declares the LORD, ‘when I will bring My people Israel and Judah back from captivity and restore them to the land I gave their ancestors to possess,’ says the LORD.” (Jeremiah 30:3). This verse speaks of the entire nation, both Israel and Judah. Pray that Jews from every tribe will be reunited in Israel.
